In July of 1982 Barbara was diagnosed as a cancer victim, three weeks before her marriage to Wayne Johnson. She fought for her life along with family and friends, and never gave up.

Barbara's life was short lived in age, but a life that was full of love from birth to death.

"We can't wish Barbara back here with us---she's not suffering anymore," said one that was very close to her.

Born Jan. 3, 1887, in Davie County, a son of the late Levi Washington and Sarah James Smith, he was a retired farmer.

Survivors include his wife, Mary Starr Smith; three daughters, Eva Mae Troutman of Raleigh, Jettie Carter and Dorothy Green, both of Mocksville; two sons, Grant Lee Smith and George Smith, both of Mocksville; a sister, Pauline Gregory of Greensboro; a brother, Jasper Smith of Greensboro; 12 grandchildren; and 22 great-grandchildren. He was also the father of the late William Clarence (Bud) Smith.

To paraphrase an observation once made by Amos Bronson Alcott, an American educator and author of the early 19th century:

"One that can find company in himself and his pursuits, cannot feel old, no matter what his years may be."

And, youth was what Enoch Washington Smith had most of his ninety-plus years of life.

Born January 3, 1887, to L.W. and Elizabeth James Smith, he was the second oldest of eight children. At the age of 25, his job with the Appalaichian Power Company took him to West Virginia. Stricken with wanderlust, he and several companions went west to Chicago, and from the Windy City on to South Dakota where he picked and husked corn in the wintertime and threshed it in the summer.

Returning to Davie County in 1916, he married Mary Starr of the West Shady Grove community. He was 29 and she was 19. They had six children: Sheriff George Everette Smith, Grant Lee Smith, Eva Mae Troutman, Jetti Mae Carter, Dorothy Rae Green and William Clarence Smith.

Traveling throughout the nation, working his farm and garden, and just plain living kept Enoch Washington Smith from realizing that he surpassed the Bible's allotted life span of 3 score and 10 years, 27 years ago.

Some people attribute their long lives to eating or not eating certain foods. Some warn not to smoke cigarettes, while others smoke two or more packs a day. Eight years ago, at the age of almost 90, Enoch Washington Smith was still most active, doing his own gardening. At that time he was quoted in an article in this newspaper as "not sure why I have lived so long, but I am sure of one thing. If someone hadn't pulled me out of an icy pond many years ago, I wouldn't be here today. I thought I was gone. I was walking out on the pond and the ice gave away."

During his 97 years Mr. Smith saw many changes take place in the world: the coming of the automobile, the airplane, the radio, television, computers—and the value of money. In 1903, he and Pink Foster worked at the Cooleemee Mill for 4-cents an hour, sweeping the weave room. Today some wage employees earn more in one hour than those two did in an entire week.

As the writer of the article about Mr. Smith observed in 1976: "Alcott did not have E.W. Smith in mind when he praised the youth in old people—but for 90 years of his life, Mr. Smith was living testimony that there is some truth in the fact."

When Christ shall come with shout of acclamation and take me home, what joy shall fill my heart!
Then I shall bow in humble adoration and there proclaim-my God How Great Thou Art!

Carl's heart was filled with joy as God claimed his soul on October 27, 1984. His progressively worsening physical condition left him more and more dependent on oxygen as he waited for God to take him home.

The life we commemorated here today is Carl, the son of Enos M. and Rebecca Ellis James born August 27, 1901 in Wadesboro, N.C. Carl was the fourth child of five and one of four boys. Enos died 1915 and left Rebecca with the farm and five children-Charlie, Bessie, Frank, Carl and Dink. Frank and Dink reside on Route 4 and remember Carl by saying: We had a good life-worked hard on the farm. Becky was the boss with Papa gone and we were a close family. Carl was a hard working, Christian family man."

On December 10, 1921, Carl and Emily Spry were united in marriage. God gave them more than 49 years of closeness and happiness together. You who loved him most, remember him in your own way, each with special memories: warm...loving...industrious...strong...God-fearing Christian...a good and kind person...a neighbor who lived peaceably among you...loved his Presnell neighbors...he loved to eat...Shatley Springs...Bar-B-Q...had a sense of humor...liked big cars and roomy trucks...listened to WDSL...liked gospel music...especially Jimmy Swaggert...a proud independent person...gave his T.V. away in disgust of daytime programming...proud of all his children-22 grandchildren and 19 great-grandchildren...will go down as a landmark of Davie County...a republican...a survivor...Pawpaw...loved children...gave away Juicy Fruit chewing gum...chewed Red Man and Juicy Fruit together...was always at church unless he was sick...a teacher...a role model...a tuff act to follow...a man of his word...beautiful prayers.
