The Rev. Richard Kerr Redwine, 91, of the N.C. Baptist Home, died there Wednesday. Funeral services will be conducted at 2 p.m. Friday at Wait Chapel by the Rev. Warren Carr. Baptist Assembly at Fort Caswell near Southport. After retiring, he served as interim pastor for several churches, including Knollwood Baptist and Lewisville Baptist Churches. He was a lifetime trustee of Wake Forest University and an active participant in the N.C. Baptist Foundation. Surviving are two sisters, Miss Alberta Redwine of the N.C. Baptist Home and Mrs. James Blackburn of Hayes; a number of nephews, and one niece. The family will receive friends at Vogler's Reynolda Road Chapel from 7 to 9 p.m. Thursday.

Retired Minister, 91, Dies

The Rev. Richard Kerr Redwine, a retired Baptist minister and interim pastor for several Winston-Salem churches, died yesterday at the N.C. Baptist Home. He was 91. Redwine, born in Davie

County, was a graduate of Wake Forest University and Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in Louisville, Ky. He was a pastor of churches in the Pilot Mountain Baptist Association; Atlanta; Marion, Ala.; Hickory; and Mount Airy. After he retired, he was interim pastor at several local churches.

In 1970, Redwine and his wife, Beatrice Barnard Redwine, who died in June, set up a trust fund with the N.C. Baptist Foundation, naming Wake Forest University, Southern Baptist Theological Seminary, Meredith and Mars Hill colleges and the Cooperative Program of the Baptist State Convention as beneficiaries.

The funeral will be at 2 p.m. Friday at Wait Chapel with burial in Forsyth Memorial Park.
