Survivors in addition to his mother, include his wife Ann Day Stoner; and one son, Michael Lee Stoner of the home.


ROY HOYT MARTIN, SR.

Genealogy The Mullican Family

The Mullican family history was written by N. Spencer Mullican in the 1950s and was entitled "Mullikins and Mullicans." This article will give a brief genealogy of this family.

Lewis Mullikin was born March 6, 1757 in Montgomery County, Md. and married Susannah Jarvis of Frederick, Md. Nov. 9, 1775. He enlisted in the Continental Army in 1776 in Company of Foot under Captain Benjamin Speaker and was attached to the "Flying Corps" and served under Colonel Murdock in General Smallwood's brigade. This record is found in Maryland Revolutionary Records by Harvey W. Newman, page 39.

Mullikin was discharged from service early in 1781 and returned to Frederick, Md., where he organized a band of people to migrate to Rowan County, N.C. They left October 1, 1781 and settled near the banks of Muddy Creek.

The children of Lewis and Susannah Mullikin were:

James (born Sept. 3, 1782); Humphrey (born March 24, 1784) who married Jane Potts and then Nancy Howard) Zedoc (born June 16, 1786, died before 1835); Thomas (born June 4, 1788) and married Casey Myers; Elizabeth (born June 20, 1794) and married Zedoc Thompson; and Sarah (born June 28, 1797) and married John Brindle. These names were recorded in the old Mullikin family Bible.

Lewis Mullikin died in April, 1836. His will named his wife Susannah as principal heiress to his estate, along with his grandson, Lewis Spencer Mullican, who was the son of Humphrey who had moved to Hope, Indiana and left this son and a daughter to be raised by his parents.

Susannah filed for the Revolutionary

War Pension in her dead husband's name in 1842 and was granted \$9 per month as his widow. They are buried at Muddy Creek Church of Christ cemetery near Clemmons.

The grandson, Lewis Spencer Mullican, was born May 11, 1808 and married Saloma Rominger (born Feb. 2, 1808) on Feb. 22, 1827. His mother died when Lewis was four years old and he lived with his grandparents on their farm until he married. Later when his grandfather died in 1836, he and his family moved back to the homeplace and inherited it after his grandmother's death.

He was not a secessionist, but when the War Between the States erupted, he threw his support behind the Confederacy. This caused a serious breach with his son Eli, who joined the Union Army, 13th Calvary.

Later he advised another son, Lewis, to join the Confederacy and he tried to enlist, but was rejected because of a physical disability.

Lewis Spencer was a farmer, a cobbler and a school teacher in the Clemmons area. He received his teaching certificate in Jan. 1880.

The children of Lewis Spencer and Saloma Mullican were: Martha Carolyn (1830-1884) who married A.H. Ellis; Sarah Elizabeth (1835-1844); Amanda Rosina (1838-1878) who married Charlie Brendle; Eli Wilson (1840-1937) who married Sarah Nelson in 1868 and after her death married in Tenn. to Susan Shutt; Lewis Cornelius (1846-????) who married Nancy Vest in 1868; Rebecca Virginia (1850-1937) who married Samuel Joseph Davis in 1868; and Enoch Pierce (1853-????) who married Katie Krites in 1877.

Lewis Spencer died April 23, 1889 and Saloma died May 31, 1894 and they are buried at Muddy Creek Church of Christ.

The Orrell Family

The first Orrell in this area was listed as Daniel Oirel in the 1790 Census of the Salisbury District of Rowan County (later to become Davie County.)

On December 8, 1790 he bought 100 acres of land for 60 pounds on Ellis Creek next to Evan Ellis, Joseph Wolfscale and David Hendrix. This was purchased from Abraham and Margaret Little.

In 1801 he bought 218 acres on Carters Creek for \$436 from Michael Smith.

Daniel Orrell was a trustee of Pleasant Grove Methodist Episcopal Chapel in 1812 when he sold 1 1/2 acres of land on Haines Mill Creek for 20 shillings to the trustees of the church. Besides himself, the other trustees were Hardy Jones, Charles and Joshua Caton.

Daniel Orrell married a woman named Nancy (last name unknown) and they were the parents of 13 children. These children, along with wife Nancy, were listed in the Rowan County will of Daniel Orrell in 1830:

James; Edgar, who married Ruthey Caton in 1810; Robert, who married Candis Mustion, in 1811; John, who married Nancy Chesier in 1814; Daniel, who married Susanna Tucker in 1818; William; Samuel; Nancy Orrell Sheets; Elizabeth Orrell Caton; Mary Orrell Markland; Lydia Orrell Etchison; Anna Orrell; and Letha Orrell Call.

Daniel's widow Nancy died in 1833 and her Rowan County will named her son Samuel as the executor.

Daniel's obituary of November 26, 1830 is listed in the bound book "Western Carolinian Newspaper Obituaries and Marriages."

Descendants of this man are located near Advance and also in western Forsyth County.

Further information on this family may be found in the Davie County courthouse records of marriages, deeds and wills and in the Censuses and tax records of that county.

The Orrell Family

The first Orrell in this area was listed as Daniel Oirel in the 1790 Census of the Salisbury District of Rowan County (later to become Davie County.)

On December 8, 1790 he bought 100 acres of land for 60 pounds on Ellis Creek next to Evan Ellis, Joseph Wolfscale and David Hendrix. This was purchased from Abraham and Margaret Little.

In 1801 he bought 218 acres on Carters Creek for \$436 from Michael Smith.

Daniel Orrell was a trustee of Pleasant Grove Methodist Episcopal Chapel in 1812 when he sold 1 1/2 acres of land on Haines Mill Creek for 20 shillings to the trustees of the church. Besides himself, the other trustees were Hardy Jones, Charles and Joshua Caton.

Daniel Orrell married a woman named Nancy (last name unknown) and they were the parents of 13 children. These children, along with wife Nancy, were listed in the Rowan County will of Daniel Orrell in 1830:

James; Edgar, who married Ruthey Caton in 1810; Robert, who married Candis Mustion, in 1811; John, who married Nancy Chesier in 1814; Daniel, who married Susanna Tucker in 1818; William; Samuel; Nancy Orrell Sheets; Elizabeth Orrell Caton; Mary Orrell Markland; Lydia Orrell Etchison; Anna Orrell; and Letha Orrell Call.

Daniel's widow Nancy died in 1833 and her Rowan County will named her son Samuel as the executor.

Daniel's obituary of November 26, 1830 is listed in the bound book "Western Carolinian Newspaper Obituaries and Marriages."

Descendants of this man are located near Advance and also in western Forsyth County.

Further information on this family may be found in the Davie County courthouse records of marriages, deeds and wills and in the Censuses and tax records of that county.
