



Two insect species have been named for her: a Venezuelan termitophilous beetle, *Neophiloterme mcmahanae*, and a Costa Rican assassin bug, *Salyavata mcmahanae*. In 1987 she retired after 26 years at UNC-CH, and joined the Peace Corps to teach zoology for a year at Jamaica's College of Agriculture. In 1989

she moved to Carolina Meadows, a Chapel Hill retirement community. Beginning in 1995, she made eight annual roundtrips to Australia-New Zealand on cargo ships. The time and isolation resulted in the writing and illustrating of 10 children's books for young friends and relatives. She self-published two illustrated "autobiographies" (*Heart and Nerve* and *Sinew and Warming Both Hands before the Fire of Life*). The latter, plus papers relating to her research, travels, and work in the Duke Parapsychology Laboratory, are with the Sallie Bingham Center for Women's History and Culture, part of the special collections of the Duke University Library. In 2004 her friends and former students surprised her with the initiation of an endowment in her name at the N.C. State University Library for the purchase of entomological literature, especially that relating to social insects. She would be honored by contributions to this fund in lieu of flowers. 


