For five years he attended the one-room "Sheek's School House" which stood near the present Kinderton branch of Bank of America. His teacher was Miss Effie Smith, the wife of Duke Smith. Later the family inherited land and moved into an old log house which down a dirt road behind where the BBT bank is located in Bermuda Run. He said the first paid job he remembered having was carrying buckets of water from a spring at 5 cents per bucket to workers building the Mocksville to Winston Highway (US 158). He was 14 when the Great Depression hit but he said they were so poor they could not tell any difference. As a teenager he started working as a hired hand on the S. Clay Williams Farm. In 1935 he left Davie County and went to Logan County, W.Va. to work in the coal mines. When asked why he left Davie County he gave the following

explanation: "My pay was 1 dollar a day working a 10 hour day on the William's Farm, and we only got about 3 days of work a week. I started shoveling coal at 40 cents per ton. I had to buy my powder, carbide and tools from the company store but I could still average about 4 dollars a day and I was able to work six days a week."

He married his wife Cleo on. June 15, 1937 and she preceded him in death. They had four children: James Jr., Betty, and Gerald who survive, and Billy Ray (who preceded his mother and father in death).

He was a member of the United Mine Workers and retired in 1972 from the Island Creek Coal Co. In 1975 he bought a large farm in Monroe County, W.Va. and spent his retirement years farming, hunting, and feeding deer. He was active and hard working. When he was 95 he was on the mountain cutting wood and turned his four-wheeler over. He was pinned beneath the ATV for several hours before someone found him. He never fully recovered after this accident.



Col. Phillip O. Newman. 89, a U.S. Army Air Corps pilot who flew a B-17 in more than 50 missions during World War II, died Saturday, Jan. 6, in Winston-Salem.

Newman, who was born March 27, 1923, in Greensboro, flew most of his missions out of a base in Foggia, Italy, as the push against Germany intensified in the last years of the war. His unit was the 15th Air Force, 99th Bomb Group, 347 Bomb Squadron. After the war, he went to work for Western Auto Supply, rising to wholesale sales manager. He then created another career as owner of Cascade Communications, a distributor of electronic equipment. He remained in the Air Force Reserve until 1955. He continued visiting high schools in North Carolina and Florida, where he described the war, but lamented the lack of knowledge American youngsters have of World War II history. He was married for 59 years to Blanche Triska Newman, who died in 2003. Their son, Charles Timothy. died of complications resulting from multiple sclerosis in 2008. In 2008, he married Aurelia "Chick" Wallace, whom he had known since childhood. She died in 2010. Newman's later years were filled with interviewing World War II veterans for oral history projects, attending air shows, speaking on radio talk shows, and, especially, telling young people about the war. As a founding member of Combat Airmen of WWII, Reidsville, he could be found, at one time or another.

in classrooms and cafeterias, explaining the effort that led to victory in the war. He first flew a B-17 when he was "17 and a half."
